Developing Questions

- A. Focus on one or two ideas per study
- B. Create open-ended questions
- C. Examples of questions:
 - How would you explain this passage to a child?
 - What points stood out to you from this week's study?
 - What if Jonah had gone to Nineveh straight away. What might the outcome have been? For the Ninevites, for Jonah, for us?
 - How does this passage demonstrate God's love?



- D. Ask: What, why, how
- E. Dig deeper!
 - Why is this true?
 - What makes you think this is true?
 - What if it isn't true?

 - Reading diverse perspectives













- 1. Service projects during Sabbath School
- 2. Outreach during the week








- 1. Opportunity to try new things
